- **Methods/Approach:** What is your study design? How will you collect data? Is your approach feasible within \$50K?
- **Preliminary Data (if applicable):** Do you have any preliminary findings?
- **Timeline:** How long will the project take?
- **Budget Overview:** Roughly how will you use the \$50K? (More detail optional—see budget narrative section)

Our reviewers are looking for clear, compelling, feasible research. Clarity is more important than exhaustive detail.

SECTION 5: TEAM EXPERTISE & ENVIRONMENT
